Lesotho Projects - Ministry Update

Nearly every Basotho family living in Lesotho has strong ties to their flocks and their fields. Herdsmen and farmers are at the core of Basotho culture as well as Lesotho's economy.

In November, a team from Daylight Media Ministries joined a team from Africa Inland Mission to shoot two new documentary videos about missionary outreach efforts within these important sectors of Lesotho culture.

Growing Nations

In a country that was once the breadbasket of southern Africa, traditional framing methods produced crop yields sufficient to feed the Basotho people with enough left over to sell and trade with their neighbors in South Africa. The introduction of so-called modern farming techniques involving deep plowing has changed all that. The first project will tell the story of missionaries involved in no-till agricultural training to reverse the effects of deep plowing.

Shepherds of Men

Any student of scripture will recognize that God must have a special place in His heart for shepherds. Central characters in the Old and New Testaments led solitary lives herding their animals to good pastures and protecting them from predators. Today, there is a new effort to reach Lesotho's shepherds with literacy and discipleship programs. Plans are underway to establish an orate Bible school where shepherds will be trained to use their traditional story-telling skills to evangelize their own fellow shepherds and one day, the rest of their tribe.

The filming is now completed and editing is underway with hopes of finishing these two projects by early February 2010.
